Having a go



- Log 50 VHF/UHF unique contacts.
- Log contacts with unique amateur radio stations in three of the home countries.
- Log 50 unique HF contacts using CW or Phone modes.
- Log 50 unique HF contacts using digital data modes.
- Log 10 unique contacts using SSTV or FSTV image modes.
- Log 10 unique contacts using digital data modes.
- Log 10 unique contacts using digital data modes.
 - 1 point for each achieved

Getting involved



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- Activate a Summits On The Air summit.
- Log unique contacts in 20 different Worked All Britain squares.
- Log 10 successful contacts with unique stations in one contest.
- Help set-up and/or tear-down a special event, contest, or club station.
- Operate and/or log at a special event, contest, or club station.
 - 1 point for each achieved

Taking part



- Attend 6 club meetings.
- Take part in 6 club nets.
- Undertake a role in the club on a regular basis - this can be anything from making the tea each week, to holding a position on the committee.
- Take part in a RAYNET event.
- Help organise an activity for the club.
 - 1 point for each achieved

Making

- Build a piece of amateur radio-related electronic or mechanical equipment for your shack.
- Write an amateur radio-related piece of software that you can use in your shack or design a simple website.
 - 1 point for each achieved

Promoting amateur radio



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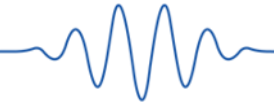


- Introduce somebody to the hobby who then goes on to start a Foundation course.
- Attend a rally, or exhibition, to promote your chosen Club Scheme accredited club.
- Help run a training course at your chosen Club Scheme accredited club by teaching, supporting, running practical sessions, or invigilating.
 - 1 point for each achieved

How will I be rewarded for my achievements?



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- As you progress through the scheme, and complete activities successfully, you will receive awards to recognise your progress; Bronze, Silver, Gold, Platinum and Diamond.
 - Bronze 3 points
 - Silver 5 points
 - Gold 10 points
 - Platinum 15 points
 - Diamond 23 points (i.e. all categories)
